Subj: ENTERPRISE SAFETY APPLICATIONS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (ESAMS)
IMPLEMENTATION

Ref: (a) MCO 5100.29B

1. Situation. Commanding General, Marine Corps Logistics Command (MARCORLOGCOM) is committed to providing world-class safety and occupational health (SOH) programs for our total force. ESAMS is a web-based safety management system that will enable MARCORLOGCOM to standardize SOH mishap reporting, training, medical monitoring, facility deficiency data compilation, and recordkeeping. It is the safety management system that will be used by MARCORLOGCOM for reporting and tracking all safety related data. It provides a secure, Navy Marine Corps Intranet (NMCI) compliant, web-based means to manage all of the MARCORLOGCOM's SOH program requirements. The system will provide leadership at all levels the ability to monitor safety programs and performance. Additionally, ESAMS has the ability to link with other planning and work execution programs to provide safety training and job-specific preventative measures for our in-house civilian and military workforce. Those features will be leveraged as the utilization of ESAMS matures. Once fully implemented, ESAMS will decrease the effort required to conduct and record training, increasing efficiency by automating many of the SOH data calls and recurring reporting requirements.

2. Mission. By the end of FY13, all MARCORLOGCOM commands will fully implement ESAMS, to include the use of ESAMS for reporting all civilian and military mishaps and near misses, recording all safety training, reporting facility deficiencies resulting from safety inspections, tracking all required medical monitoring for MARCORLOGCOM employees, and extracting in-house safety program metrics.

3. Execution

a. MARCORLOGCOM commands currently using other safety record

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management systems will transition to ESAMS in support of the Marine Corps' computer application reduction effort. ESAMS is currently available across MARCORLOGCOM. Commands must complete their administrative and data accuracy updates, as well as training documentation, before ESAMS will provide a valid summary of their SOH programs.

b. To assist the implementation process, MARCORLOGCOM Commanders and Center Directors will assign an ESAMS program administrator and at least one alternate. Provide names, phone numbers, and email addresses of ESAMS program administrators to the ESAMS assistants, in the office of Installations, Environment, and Safety (IE&S). These unit or center level program administrators will receive the necessary training provided by the ESAMS Program Manger's team, and will assist in the full implementation of ESAMS by the end of the fiscal year.
